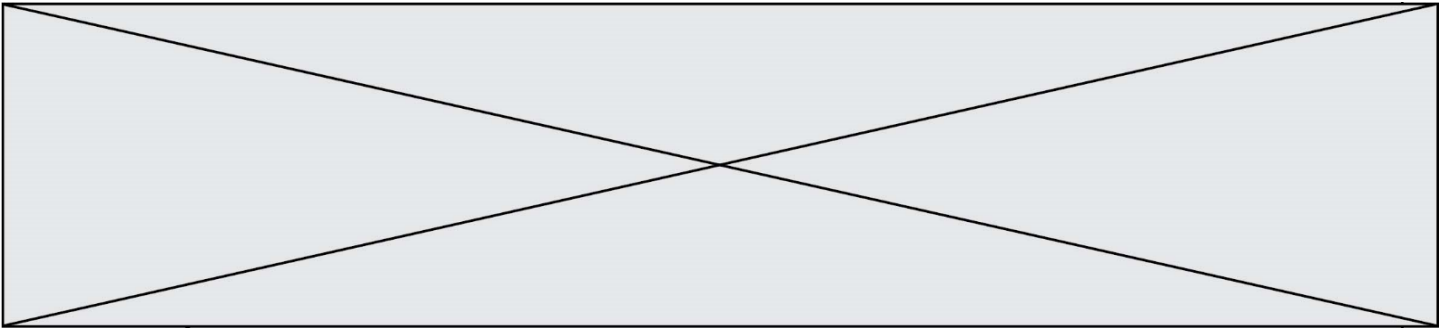

Texte 1

Facebook changes its name to Meta

Facebook has changed its company name to Meta. It is part of a rebrand for the company who want to expand into other areas like virtual reality (VR). The name of its social media platforms Facebook, Instagram and Whatsapp won't change, just the parent company that owns them.

- 5 The word meta comes from the Greek language meaning beyond. Mark Zuckerberg, boss of Facebook, announced the new name and explained his plans to create a metaverse, which the company say is "a place where we'll play and connect in 3D." This virtual world wouldn't be for just gaming but you'd also be able to meet friends, work and go to concerts all through the metaverse.
- 10 At the company's headquarters in California they unveiled a new sign, changing from the old thumbs up logo to the new blue infinity shape. Facebook's name change to Meta has been questioned. Critics of the company say they have done this to move attention away from lots of negative stories about them.

- 15 This includes the recent reports from journalists at The Wall Street Journal, that Facebook, which owns Instagram, was hiding research it had done about how social media affects young people. Instagram had carried out focus groups, surveys and diary studies into how young people felt using their app and they didn't share the results. There were also leaked documents from an ex employee, Frances Haugen, who claimed the social media company put profits before user safety. Zuckerberg said the reports are a way "to selectively use leaked documents to paint a false picture of our company".

Texte 2

Do Therapy Apps Really Protect Your Privacy?

- Text-based mental health apps like BetterHelp aren't as private as you might have hoped. It's no surprise that after a year of unprecedented (remember that word?) isolation, there was a significant surge in users seeking out remote therapy and mental health apps.
- 5 In terms of increasing mental health awareness and decreasing mental health stigma, more people seeking out help is a positive thing. However, as with anything you download onto your phone, therapy apps come with data and privacy concerns—perhaps even more concerns than other apps, considering the sensitive nature of what you disclose to virtual therapists.
- 10 Text-based therapy and mental health apps like Talkspace, MindDoc, and (perhaps the most well-known) BetterHelp, offer major benefits. These apps are typically more affordable and certainly more convenient compared to in-person appointments.
- 15 But in 2020, Jezebel reporters investigated the "loosely regulated world of online therapy," with a focus on BetterHelp in particular. Similarly, earlier this year, researchers in Consumer Reports' Digital Lab evaluated seven popular therapy apps, including BetterHelp, in order to uncover what happens to your personal information after you share it with the app.
