## Two New England Patriots say they will refuse Trump's White House invite

The patriots, a famous American football team, have just won the Super Bowl. It is customary for the winners to be invited by the president of the United States.

Devin McCourty has become the second New England Patriots player to confirm he will not accept an invitation to the White House from Donald Trump.

Tight end Martellus Bennett said on Sunday he would decline the president's customary invitation for the Super Bowl winners, and McCourty followed suit by saying: "I can't imagine a way I go there."

McCourty, a two-time Pro Bowler, told Time: "I'm not going to the White House. Basic reason for me is I don't feel accepted in the White House. With the president having so many strong opinions and prejudices I believe certain people might feel accepted there while others won't."

10 Earlier in the season, before a game against the Cardinals, McCourty and Bennett raised their right fists during the national anthem in support of the protest started by San Francisco 49ers quarterback Colin Kaepernick.

Bennett said that "America was built on inclusiveness not exclusiveness" and said he wouldn't be attending any event with Donald Trump.

15 Trump was rooting for the Patriots on Sunday night and tweeted his congratulations to the team after their 34-28 win – but the president seemed upset when the Falcons were dominating. He left his own Super Bowl party when the Patriots were down 28-3.

WASHINGTON, D.C. It was a stand that shocked the world; American sprinters Tommie Smith and John Carlos on the medal podium, raising their black-gloved fists in protest at the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City.

Smith said the moment was overwhelming."The national anthem is exactly 1 minute 5 and 30 seconds long, but it seemed like an hour," he said

That protest against racial inequality got them ejected from the games and banished from the Olympic community for decades.

Extending gloved hands skyward in racial protest, U.S. athletes Tommie Smith,

"Yes we were hated, were were vilified. But I do think because we were hated and vilified that shows you that there was something that needed changing," Smith said.

15 On Thursday, nearly 50 years later, the Olympic medalists were welcomed back into the fold by President Obama, who was hosting 2016 Olympians at the White House.

"We're honored to have here the legendary Tommie Smith and John Carlos here today," Obama said.

"Their powerful silent protest in the 1968 games was controversial, but it woke folks 20 up and created greater opportunity for those who followed," he said.

"I felt great. I stood up there and just ate it all up," said Smith.

Now a new generation of athletes has picked up the baton from Smith, led by NFL quarterback Colin Kapernick, who kneels during the national anthem to protest police violence against African-Americans.

25 Smith supports activist athletes, and said their peaceful actions take courage.

"When you do something and you really believe in it, you really don't think about the cost, you just do it," he said. And these silent gestures are meant to speak volumes.
